"Purr-r, purr-r, purr-r," O let us have the pie.



FALL ACTIVITIES 2021

After a busy summer, Old Fort Niagara is preparing for its fall season. Hours of operation for fall are Wednesday through Sunday from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

FALL FRONTIER DAYS

Fall Frontier Days are coming up on September 30, October 1, 7, 8, 14, 15, 21 and 22. These school programs are designed to serve about 4,000 students. The Niagara Falls National Heritage Area and the New York State Connect Kids program sponsor them. Activities include many outdoor living history stations that help students better understand what life on the Niagara Frontier was like during the 18th century. Topics include Native American history and culture, soldier life, trade and commerce, architecture and engineering.

FRENCH HERITAGE DAYS

French Heritage Days are set for November 5 and 6, 2021. Friday's program is designed for foreign language and social studies students and Saturday's program is for the general public. The program includes French soldier life, Native American diplomacy, French cuisine, the fur trade, religion, outdoor survival skills and much more. THANKSGIVING WEEKEND HOURS

Thanksgiving weekend brings family get-togethers for many in the Youngstown area. Old Fort Niagara will be closed on Thanksgiving Day, but we will be open with special living history activities on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

THE CASTLE BY CANDLELIGHT

On Saturday nights, December 11 and 18, Old Fort Niagara will host its annual Castle by Candlelight fundraising event. Old Fort Niagara assumes a particularly festive air during the holiday season. The Castle by Candlelight includes a tour of the Great Lakes' oldest building illuminated entirely by candles. Visitors to the event also enjoy handmade natural decorations by the award-winning Youngstown Garden Club. Throughout the Fort, visitors will encounter members of the Fort's 18th century garrison demonstrating everything from quill pens to fur trading to traditional games of skill. Twice each evening the garrison turns out to perform a grand feu de joie (firing of joy), a rolling fire of muskets and cannons. Cooks prepare a holiday feast, musicians play popular songs of the era and a Recollect priest reads the Christmas story in Latin in the Fort's 290-year-old chapel. Admission to the event (a fund-raiser to benefit educational programming) is \$25.00 per person. Tickets will be available at the door.

ON DISPLAY IN THE VISITOR CENTER


During World War II, one of the German prisoners of war held at Fort Niagara was artist, Ernst Wille. He is best known for the mural he painted on the east wall of the Fort Niagara Officers Club. Wille produced many other works however, and a special exhibit at the Old Fort Niagara Visitor Center showcases these paintings. The exhibit includes a painting of a Normandy beach he completed on June 4, 1944, just two days before the Allied invasion. The peaceful scene belies what was about to occur.
